2 Update on commitments

Commitment 1: Open Budget

 Progress is being made on building agency capability, encouraging compliance, and the proactive release of material.

Commitment 3: Improving open data access and principles

Commitment 4: Tracking progress and outcomes of open government data release

- Both Commitment 3 and 4 have had delays in delivery, with the Open Government Information and Data Programme moving from <u>LINZ to Statistics New Zealand</u>. This move was completed in March 2017, giving an opportunity for greater focus and pace in the foundation work needed to deliver on these commitments, including work on the potential to join the International Open Data Charter.
- There are likely to be opportunities to align this work with Australia's Open Data programme
 following the 19 February release of a joint statement (PDF, 108KB) from the Prime Ministers
 of Australia and New Zealand in which they agreed to:

"...collaborate on public data initiatives to better align agendas, share lessons learnt on best practice, and work together on data commitments as part of the Open Government Partnership."

Commitment 5: Ongoing engagement for OGP

Commitment 7: Improving policy practices

Progress is being made on the delivery of an online policy analysis methods toolkit. The
